



From The Preacher's Pen "NUMBERED WITH THE ELEVEN"

Though very little is known about the man Matthias, God reveals to us a great deal by introducing him as being "numbered with the eleven apostles" (Acts 1:26). First, we learn that he was qualified to be an apostle. Matthias had "companied with us [the 12 apostles] all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, Beginning from the baptism of John, unto that same day that He was taken up from us, must one be ordained to be a witness with us of His resurrection" Acts 1:21-22). In essence, Matthias had watched and learned at the very feet of the Master Teacher for about three years and had witnessed Jesus' humility, service, obedience, power, death, resurrection and ascension firsthand. Second, we know that Matthias had "an honest and good heart having heard the Word," he kept it, and brought forth fruit with patience (Luke 8:15). We know this because Peter and the other apostles "prayed, and said, Thou, Lord, which knowest the hearts of all men, shew whether of these two thou hast chosen" (Acts 1:24). Third, Matthias loved God more than he loved anything on earth. Jesus says, "if any man come to Me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be My disciple" (Luke 14:26). Matthias had also counted the cost of discipleship (Luke 14:27-33) and was willing to endure the baptism of suffering which accompanied all the apostles (Mat. 20:22-23) even to the point of death (Rev. 2:10). We learn all of this about Matthias simply because God says that Matthias "was numbered with the eleven apostles."

There is nothing in God's Holy Word that would imply that Matthias did anything but serve faithfully until death. There is no mention in the Bible of Matthias being jealous of Peter, seemingly the most outspoken of the twelve, or accusing Peter of taking "too much" upon himself (see Numbers 16). There is no inference that Matthias ever sought special prominence in Jesus' kingdom (c.f., Mat. 20:20-21). It seems that Matthias was not interested in how much would be written about him in the providentially preserved New Testament of Jesus Christ. He was simply content and honored to be "numbered with the eleven."

There are many today, even in the religious world, who are extremely fascinated (or obsessed) with themselves. Seeking renown and special recognition, many do what they do to "be seen of men" (Mat. 6:5) and love "the praise of men more than the praise of God" (John 12:43). It should not be our desire to be "known" and offered the "best seat in the house" everywhere we go (c.f., Luke 20:46-47). Jesus says, "when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, 'We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do" (Luke 17:10). If, when we pass from this life to the next, all that can be said of us is that we were numbered "with the saints, and of the household of God" (Eph. 2:19), how beautiful Heaven will be.
